Student Re-registration

Student re-registration underway; \$20 fee savings per child available

District parents will be utilizing the online student re-registration and payment process for all returning students for the upcoming 2015-2016 school year. This process helps the District adequately plan for the upcoming year to retain the best teachers for verified student enrollment. Beginning March 16, a link to the re-registration form will be active at <u>www.studentregistration.org</u>. During online re-registration, current student information can be

confirmed and updated. Parents will need to enter their child's Access ID and Password. Parents will be receiving this information in a letter to be mailed the week of March 2. The re-registration fee for the 2015-2016 is \$130 for students grades 1-8 through May 29, 2015. After that date, the fee will be \$150. Please complete the re-registration process today. Thank you!

Jump Rope for Heart Update

Students at Arbury Hills School jumped all over heart disease and stroke by participating in Jump Rope for Heart during their physical education classes and raising \$4,630.00 for the American Heart Association. The funding will support life-saving research and local education programs to fight heart disease and stroke, the nation's No. 1 and No. 4 killers.

During this year's Jump Rope for Heart event, all Arbury Hills Elementary students took part in various stations with different types of rope jumping activities. Arbury Hills has been participating in Jump Rope for Heart for the past 15 years and has raised more than \$55,000, for the American Heart Association. Jake Doyle, a third grade student at Arbury Hills, was the top fundraiser with a total of \$350.00 raised.

I am extremely proud of our Arbury Hills students! Their enthusiasm and commitment to helping others with heart defects through their jumping and fundraising efforts is truly inspiring.

Jump Rope for Heart, in its 36th year, is a program that promotes physical activity and heart health through jumping rope. Nationwide, the program has raised more than \$860 million for the fight against heart disease and stroke. Millions of students have jumped rope and learned about heart health and how nutrition and physical activity can help prevent heart disease and stroke. Jump Rope for Heart is co-sponsored by the American Heart Association and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance.

Tech Bytes

Our first grade students continued to use Microsoft Word in technology class this month. The students practiced keyboarding skills while using the tablets to complete the tale "If I were a leprechaun, I would ..." They also learned how to add Clip Art and resize images.

Our second grade students continued to use Microsoft Word in technology class. The students learned how to add Clip Art to a document and also how to resize the images.

Our third grade students learned how to take an online quiz with our new Reading series. The students practiced logging into Think Central and completing online assignments. (Have them show you how to log in to see their scored online quiz at Think Central.) Students also continued to use Microsoft Word. They were busy adding Clip Art, resizing the images, and learning how to position the image in the text.

Our fourth grade students also continued to use Microsoft Word in technology class. The students practiced keyboarding skills while using the tablets to complete a leprechaun tale. They also practiced adding Clip Art and images from a file, resizing images, and positioning the images in the text.

During our technology integration times, students continue to use the computer lab, as well as tablet computers in their classrooms. First grade students have been busy researching the moon and practicing keyboarding skills while typing stories and letters. Many are also reinforcing math skills using the Think Central Go Math online activities. Second grade students have continued to practice math and reading skills on the computer using Study Island. Some students have been taking their weekly Reading tests on the computers and tablets also. (Have them show you how to log in to see their scored online quiz at Think Central.) Third grade students learned and reviewed landform terms and then quizzed themselves by identifying them on a landform map. Finally, fourth grade students reviewed the states of matter and phase changes using an online website and completed an online quiz about what they learned. (Many even remembered how to open a second Internet tab to go back to find information in the text to complete the quiz!) They are also beginning to gather information for their state project from digital sources.


