In personnel matters, the Board:

- accepted the resignations of music teacher Laura Stack and reading teacher Stephanie Delgrosso;
- employed Diane Dankovich as a substitute nurse for the 2009-2010 school year;
- employed Mary Kamba, Joanne Panici, and Nancy Kirschper as substitute lunchroom supervisors;
- employed Karen Lisota, Jennifer Dunlap, and Nicole Lewandowski, to fill family medical leaves of absence; and
- employed Joanna Mass as a .5 art teacher, and Ron Buoscio, Kelly Collins, Annette Barron, Ryan Hagen, and Kelly Higgins, as teachers for the 2009-2010 school year.

In other matters, the Board:

- was informed that the District had received its twenty-third consecutive IASBO (Illinois Association of School Business Officials) award for excellence in financial reporting;
- heard a presentation and approved the Lincoln-Way Area Special Education Joint Agreement 2009-2010 Budget;
- heard an update on the ELL program from Director of Special Services Julie Egan;
- heard reports from Board President Doyle of the Three Rivers Meeting that he attended and from Jim Clumpner of Architectural Resource Corporation Construction of the progress made in the construction projects in the district;
- reviewed and approved the destruction of closed session recordings for the period of July 1, 2007 through December, 2007;
- established the hearing for the 2009-10 Budget to be conducted at 8 p.m. on September 9, 2009;
- authorized the President and the Superintendent to sign the Application for Building Permit for Walker Intermediate School Paving Work;
- accepted a gift of \$115 from the South Suburban Wildcats;
- approved the final reading of Board Policy 5:330;
- granted the Superintendent permission to engage in limited university teaching for Fall 2009;
- set the date of July 14, 2009 at 5:30 p.m. for the review of District Goals, Board Self-Evaluation, and discussion of the Board/Superintendent Relationship;
- authorized the purchase of on-line professional development services;
