FUTURE-FOCUSED

GOAL 1:

Improve student achievement/academic performance on the pathway to high school readiness and future college/career readiness through a challenging, rigorous, yet supportive and enjoyable curriculum. (Policy 6:10)

- Systematically improve PSAT Summary Results Scores, student achievement scores, student groups whose performance is discrepant from the overall student scores, and overall student growth.
- Review efficacy of District-wide academic interventions (MTSS, Multi-Tiered Systems of Support)
- Investigate Gifted/Accelerated opportunities (in part Policy 6:130 and 6:135)
- · Enhance District tiered social and emotional curriculum and supports to have a more personalized education and safe learning environment for ALL students and staff. (Policy 6:65)
- . Increase resources for E.C. and Kindergarten. ensuring school readiness is prioritized and support is in place to intervene as early as possible
- Promote community service as an essential aspect to ongoing learning for both staff and students.
