Each item that is noted in the weekly learning board with the request, "<u>Send me a picture</u>," will be entered separately in PowerSchool. Daily Freckle participation is a district expectation and will also be recorded in PowerSchool. As of now, all assignments will be marked as collected, incomplete, or missing. We will also continue to provide comments that offer specific feedback on assignments. Please know that changes at the state or district level could create a need to update our grading practices. If that occurs, we will share updated practices in a timely fashion.

## Thursday

ELA – Spelling word sentences Freckle – 30 minutes ELA Library
