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Directions for Use

- Project one of the pictures in this resource. You can do this on an ActivBoard for the entire class, or project on an individual computer to make this a center activity for individual students or small groups.
- Tell students they are going to write a story for the picture. You can tell them how many sentences they will write (check out the three response sheet options within this resource), or students can write freely. It's up to you how many parameters you set!
- Here are a few options for using this resource:
 - Do these on those days where you are short on time (late start, early out, school pictures, etc.) and can't do a full writing lesson. (A little writing is better than no writing!)
 - Complete a picture (or two or three!) on the days when your students are out of focus.
 Some days if you can't beat em, join em!

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
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
